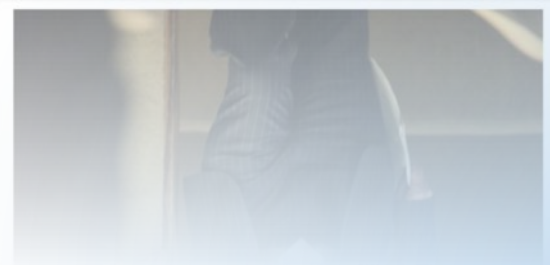

Peter Sutherland

Former UN Secretary General's Special Representative for International Migration (SRSG)
Founding Father of the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD)

Peter was 71 years of age and died at St. James's Hospital, Dublin on Sunday January 7th in the presence of his family. He is survived by his loving wife Maruja, née Cabria Valcarcel, his children Shane, Natalia and Ian, ten grandchildren, his sisters Jill and Karen, his brother-in-law David Brennan, his daughters-in-law, his son-in-law, his wider family and friends.

Peter was born in Dublin on April 25, 1946. He went to school at Gonzaga College SJ which helped to instill a strong religious faith and where he formed lifelong friendships. He studied law at University College, Dublin and at the King's Inns. He was called to the Bar in 1969 and practiced law until 1981 when he became Attorney General of Ireland. He was a member of the European Commission from 1985 to 1989. Between 1989 and 1993, Peter was chairman of AIB plc and a director of CRH plc and GPA. From 1993 to 1995, he was Director General of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and subsequently the World Trade organisation. He was subsequently a Partner at and Chairman of Goldman Sachs International and Chairman of BP plc among numerous other roles in the commercial and not-for-profit sector. In 2006, he was proud to be asked to be United Nations Special Representative on Migration by then-Secretary General Kofi Annan. He was renewed in that role by Ban Ki-moon. In 2015, Peter retired from all commercial activities to concentrate on his UN work.

Recommendation 16:

Strengthen United Nations leadership and capacities on migration

Paragraph 79, excerpts

79. “...There is no question that IOM, whose mandate covers migration writ-large, and UNHCR, which is more narrowly focused on refugees and stateless persons, will be the natural anchors of the Organization’s strategy and institutional architecture on international migration (in all its forms) going forward. Both have vastly more resources, expertise and accumulated experience on these issues than any other entity within the system and should thus be the “centre of gravity” around which consultation and coordination are organized.”

Recommendation 16: Strengthen United Nations leadership and capacities on migration

Paragraph 81, excerpts

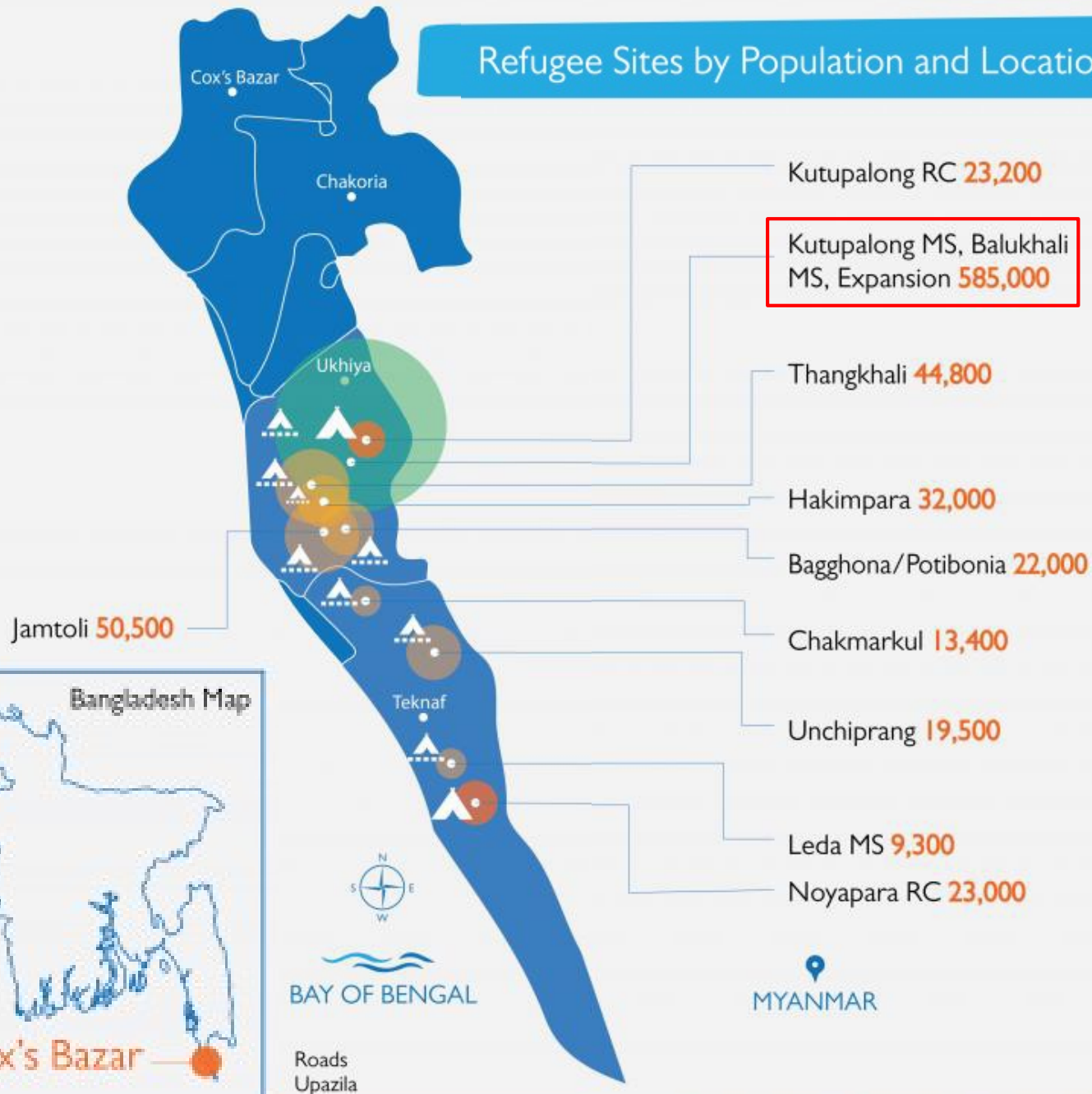
81. “A strong IOM-UNHCR team is indispensable, especially to steer the United Nations response to mixed migration flows and large, crisis-related movements (for example, through a joint programme on migrants in vulnerable situations, based on the guiding principles to be developed) and to co-lead the coordination of the work of the United Nations system on migration issues, with the support of the Global Migration Group.”

Recommendation 16: Strengthen United Nations leadership and capacities on migration

Paragraph 83, excerpts

83. “Planning on the assumption that crisis-related movements will be the “new normal”, we must fill the gaps in the protection chain, including through joint analysis and early intervention by a strong IOM-UNHCR team working together to ensure that the protection needs of migrants and refugees are identified and addressed as early and as close to their country of origin as possible.”

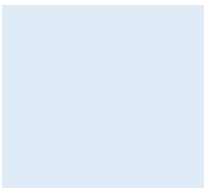
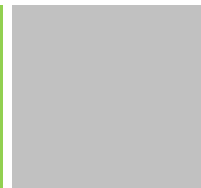

GFMD and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

- GFMD submitted its substantive input – **GFMD Recommendations to the 2017 HLPF** topic of “Eradicating poverty and promoting prosperity in a changing world,” upon the invitation of the ECOSOC President.
- At the margins of the 2017 HLPF, the GFMD hosted a side event “**GFMD Reflection on Migration-related SDGs in the Agenda 2030.**”
- With a view to **SDG target 10.7**, the GFMD Co-Chairs stressed the need to align with international processes in order to create synergies when it comes to facilitating safe, orderly and regular migration.



The GFMD Recommendations to the HLPF 2017 showcases the GFMD contribution to the 2030 Agenda in general, and particularly for the SDGs and respective targets that are most relevant to GFMD's mandates and past discussions.

GFMD and the Global Compact for Migration

- To prepare its **contribution to the GCM process**, the GFMD has organized two GFMD Dialogues on GCM, two Thematic Workshops, six GFMD Summit Roundtables framed according to GCM themes and has participated in a number of GCM preparatory events in 2017.
- At the GCM Stocktaking in Mexico, the GFMD Co-Chairs submitted the **GFMD Thematic Recollection 2007-2017** which constitutes the Global Forum's contribution to the GCM process.



The GFMD Thematic Recollection 2007-2017 reflects the diversity of discussions over the last 10 years held in the context of GFMD. The contribution thereby serves to inform the GCM process.

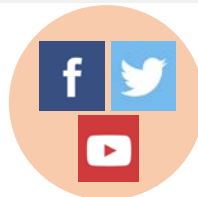

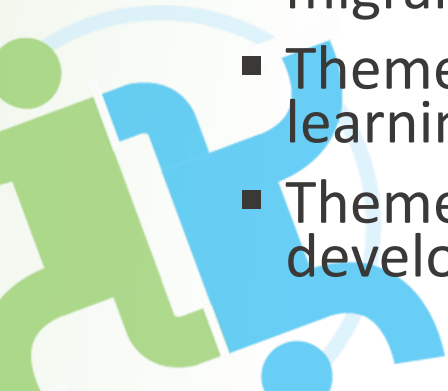

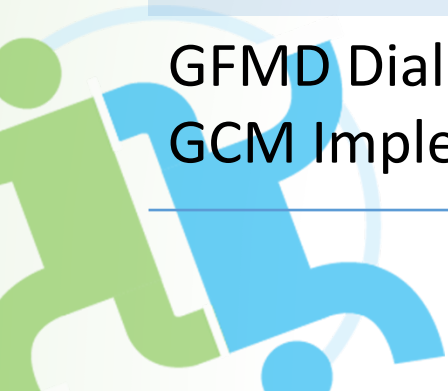
